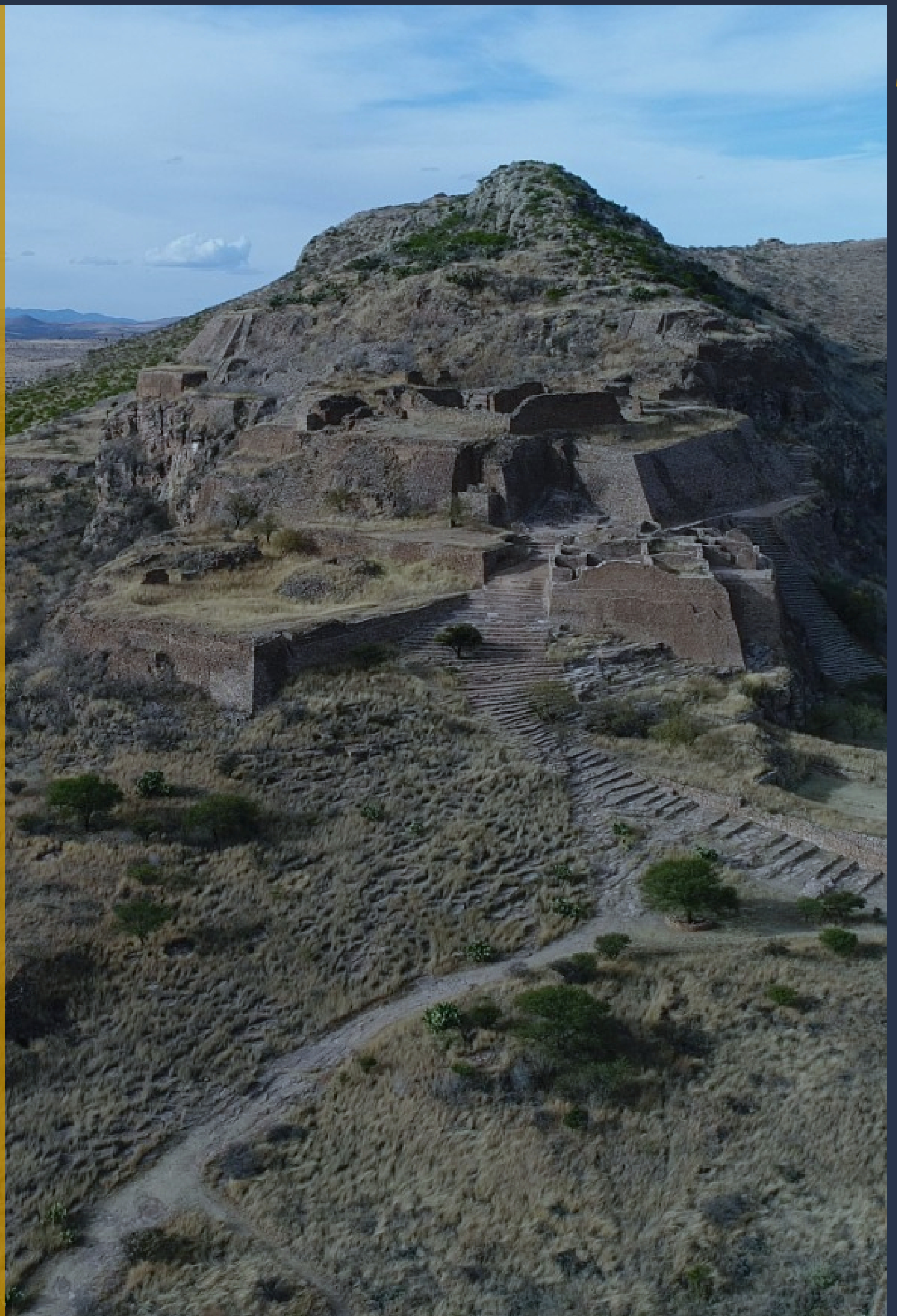

These surveys serve as the basic input for different spatial analysis using geographic information systems (GIS) as well as the basic 3D imagery for a museographic project.
